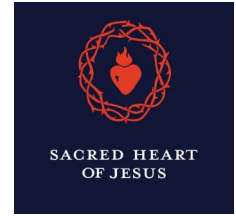

MAY 2024 SUPREME CHAPLAIN'S MONTHLY CHALLENGE

“Holy Father, keep them in your name that you have given me, so that they may be one just as we are.” (Gospel for May 12, Jn 17:11b)

Jesus desires that his disciples be united in his name: one body, one faith, one church. It is vital for our own families to remain united in faith. It is not easy to raise and form children in the Catholic faith in today’s confused culture. But as Holy Cross Father Patrick Peyton, the “rosary priest,” said, “The family that prays together stays together.” Let us keep our family united by staying united to Christ in prayer.

Council News

We will continue with nominations for officers at the next business meeting. The following officers will be elected for the next fraternal year:

Grand Knight: The Grand Knight is the highest ranking officer of his council, and is responsible for the welfare of the council. He presides over council meetings, acts as an ex-officio member of all committees, and ensures all necessary reports are submitted to the state and supreme councils.

Deputy Grand Knight: The Deputy Grand Knight assists the grand knight with operation of the council and any other duties assigned to him by the Grand Knight. In the absence of the Grand Knight, he presides at council meetings.

Chancellor: The Chancellor is the third highest ranking officer of the council. He assists the Grand Knight and Deputy Grand Knight in the performance of their duties. He exercises a special interest in new members and members who are sick or in distress. He is charged with strengthening the members' interest in council activities.

Recorder: The Recorder is responsible for keeping and maintaining a true and permanent record of all actions of the council and maintains all correspondence of the council.

Treasurer: The Treasurer is charged with handling all council funds, deposits them in the proper accounts, and is responsible for paying all council expenses.

Advocate: The Advocate acts a parliamentarian for the council.

Warden: The Warden assures that all members at meetings possess the current membership card. He is custodian of all council property except funds and is in charge of properly setting up the council chamber for meetings and ceremonial work.

Inside/Outside Guards: The Guards attend the doors of the council chamber, checking for current membership cards and allowing entrance.
